LOWER DIVISION MAJOR REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC TRANSFER UNIVERSITIES

California State University – Fullerton

Traditional BSN (Entry-level Freshman) program is for direct-entry freshman with no previous nursing education.

RN-BSN Program

Admission Requirements:

- Meet requirements for admission to the university as a transfer student.
- Completion of an A.A. degree in Nursing or equivalent.
- Current licensure as a registered nurse in California.
- Completion of college level prerequisite courses.

A minimum grade of "C" (2.0) in each of the following courses:

A&P 200 *and* 201 *or* A&P 150 *and* A&P 151

CHEM 100 *or* CHEM 110, *or* CHEM 111

MICR 200

MATH 112 *or* PSYCH 210

California State University – Los Angeles

The School of Nursing offers 4 options for attaining the BSN degree that include the: basic pre-licensure BSN program, RN-BSN transfer program, Associated Degree in Nursing (ADN) to BSN collaborative program and B.S. accelerated program accelerated program.

Basic Pre-Licensure BSN option is for students who do not have an RN license

RN-BSN Transfer option is for students who possess a California R.N. license and an AA or AS degree in Nursing.

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California State University – Long Beach

CSULB offers two bachelor's degrees:

- **Bachelor of Science in Nursing-Basic**
- **Bachelor of Science in Nursing – Registered Nurse**

The baccalaureate program offers courses that prepare the student to become a professional nurse. Two distinct categories of students are eligible for admission. The traditional basic "semester/trimester student" who enters the University without having completed a first level nursing program and the "registered nurse student", who having completed a course of study at the first level, desires further study to expand her or his nursing capabilities to the BSN professional level.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing –Basic (program is impacted.)

Students are encouraged to take as many of these courses prior to transfer as possible to promote timely completion of the degree at CSULB. Students should be aware that courses on this list may not all be required for admission but are required for the award of the bachelor's degree.

Prerequisite General Education Courses:

CSU GE Oral Communication – 3 semester units

Bachelor of Science in Nursing – Registered Nurse

In order to apply for this option a student must:

- Hold a current license or be eligible for license to practice in California.
- Graduation from an Accredited Associate degree program or evaluation of diploma program for equivalency by an Accredited Associate degree program.
- Completion of undergraduate statistics course suitable for general education mathematics credit
- Completion of an inorganic, organic &/or biochemistry course.

University of California – Los Angeles

Nursing-Generic/Pre-licensure/B.S.

The B.S. Pre-licensure program at UCLA has been designed to prepare students for a career in Nursing. The School of Nursing admits new undergraduate students once each year at the freshman level and a limited number of transfer students at the junior level.

Transfer applicants must have completed all IGETC requirements or all general education requirements at the school where currently or previously enrolled and the equivalent of all of the non-nursing preparation for the major courses as follow:

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- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 in all UC – transferable courses.
- IGETC Certification.
- Completion of the following prerequisites:
 - A&P 200 *and* A&P 201 *or*
 - A&P 150 *and* A&P 151
 - BIOL 201 *and* BIOL 202
 - CHEM 111 *and* CHEM 112
 - CHEM 211
 - ENGL 100

 - MATH 170
 - MICR 200
 - PSYC 101
 - SPCH 130

University of California – Irvine

UCI offers a B.S. degree in Nursing Science. Admission to the major is limited and selective.

Junior – level applicants with the highest grades overall and who satisfactorily complete course prerequisite will be given preference for admissions. All applicants must complete the following courses with grades of “B” or better.

Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to be considered.

How to use **ASSIST** to find your major preparation for CSU/UC:

1. **Log on:** www.assist.org
2. **Select an Institution:** select "Cerritos College" or other community college from pull-down menu
3. **Select:** "Type of Transfer Institution" such as "UC Los Angeles"
4. **Select a major from pull-down menu**
Report will show the university courses on the left and comparable community college classes on the right.
5. **PRINT:**-print by clicking on gold "**PRINT THIS REPORT**" button on top. Then use the **ASSIST** screen menu on the top toolbar or click on the printer icon that will appear at the bottom of the page.

How to use **ASSIST** to explore the majors available at University of California and California State University campuses

- Click on "EXPLORE MAJORS"

How to use **ASSIST** to figure out whether courses from the community college are transferable to the CSU/UC.

- Select the community college of interest (Cerritos College)
- Select either CSU transferable courses or UC Transferable courses
- Select a department for the courses in question
