

INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC) AA DEGREE REQUIREMENTS 2022-2023

• PLAN C is designed primarily for students who intend to transfer to the University of California (UC) or who are undecided between transfer to the UC or the California State University (CSU). A student may use PLAN C to fulfill Associate in Arts general education requirements and the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC). To complete an A.A. using PLAN C, students must also meet the Health & Wellness Proficiency requirement, specific coursework toward a major, and electives as needed to complete a minimum of 60-degree applicable units with a 2.0 GPA. PLAN C may not be recommended for some majors at certain UC or CSU campuses. PLAN C can be fulfilled by completing the IGETC requirements specified for either the UC or CSU.

PLAN C

- If a student wishes only to transfer and is not seeking an A.A. degree, there are no proficiencies required for IGETC certification. A minimum of 60 UC/ CSU transferable units is required for transfer. For other transfer requirements, please see a counselor.
- Completion of IGETC will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the UC or CSU systems without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower division general education courses.

Completion of IGETC is not a requirement for transfer to CSU or UC, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower division general education requirements of the CSU or UC prior to transfer. Depending on a student's major field of interest, the student may find it advantageous to take courses fulfilling the CSU's general education requirements or those of the UC campus or college to which the student plans to transfer.

- The course requirements for **ALL** areas must be completed **PRIOR** to transferring to the CSU or UC in order for IGETC to be certified. However, as of fall 2000, a student may be partially certified if missing no more than 2 courses. See a counselor to determine eligibility for partial certification.
- All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- A student who has completed IGETC may have official certification sent to a four-year institution upon written request through the Admissions and Records office.
- Courses asterisked (*) appear in more than one category but may be used to satisfy only one category. Courses with a "+" next to them indicate a UC credit limitation. See your counselor for details.
- Courses marked with a CL are cross listed with another course. See individual cross-listed course descriptions in the Cerritos College catalog. Cross-listed courses may only receive credit once.
- Courses in **BOLD** and <u>UNDERLINED</u> have no prerequisites but may have course recommendations. Please refer to the catalog for course recommendations.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS UC ONLY: Language Other Than English Proficiency equivalent to two years of high school study in the same language, which may be met several ways including:

- Two years of same foreign language in high school with a grade of "C"-or better
- First college course in any foreign language or American Sign Language 110
- Satisfactory completion, with C grades or better, of two years of formal schooling at the sixth-grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English.
- Satisfactory completion of an achievement test administered by a community college, university or other college in a language other than English. The test will have to assess the student's proficiency at the level equivalent to two years of high school foreign language.
- $\cdot~$ Satisfactory score on the SAT II: Subject Test in languages other than English.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS CSU ONLY: United States History, Constitution and American Ideals

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE ONLY

- · Health and Wellness Proficiency
 - Complete at least 1 unit of a course from college approved list (See list in schedule of classes, Plan A or the Cerritos College General Catalog, Plan A)
 - Complete HED 100, 101, 103, 105, or 200; HO 100, 152; CDEC 161; or WGS 103
 - Complete an Allied Health program (DA, DH, RN, PTA, Pharm Tech, MA)
 - For other options, see your counselor
- Major: complete all requirements for the chosen major under "Major Requirements" in General Catalog

The CSU has a specific American Institutions requirement that is separate from the general education requirements. Courses used to meet the American Institutions requirements may be used to satisfy requirements for IGETC, depending on the receiving CSU campuses policy. It is recommended that this requirement be met prior to transfer. The following will meet the CSU American Institutions requirements: 6 units, one course from Group 1 and one course from Group 2.

Group 1: Chicano Studies 108: History 101+, 102+, 103+, 108
 Group 2: Political Science 101+, 201+
UC-bound students should be aware of American history and institution requirements at campus of choice. Requirements vary.
