The Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) is the required degree to become a licensed physical therapist as of 2015. For specific information on schools not listed here please consult the catalogs of those schools and speak to a counselor.

California State University – Long Beach

California State University, Long Beach offers an entry-level physical therapy professional curriculum that leads to the Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) degree. To prepare for the 3-year program students must follow an undergraduate program which includes appropriate physical, biological, and behavioral science prerequisite courses before applying to the program. All students applying must hold or be eligible to hold a Bachelor's degree. A minimum 3.0 GPA is required. Average cum GPA for accepted students was 3.64. The average prerequisite GPA for accepted students was 3.75. In order to be considered competitive, the applicants overall and prerequisite GPA's should both be at least 3.50. The Department of Physical Therapy offers an entry-level Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) degree. A student applying to become a Physical Therapist applies to the entry-level DPT program. Admissions to the entry level DPT graduate program requires that an individual possess a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college or university, an overall 3.0 GPA on all completed upper division coursework and complete all prerequisites requirements prior to beginning the professional major. Students are only admitted for fall semester. Admission to the entry-level, 3-year DPT requires the following requirements.

Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Chemistry (Inorganic, Organic or Biochemistry with labs, 2 semesters, Physics with lab including mechanics, heat, light and electricity. General Psychology, Psychological Aspects of Disability or Abnormal Psychology and Introduction to basic statistics. Please consult www.assist.org for more information regarding specific courses. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

Physical Therapists help persons with various diseases or injuries to overcome their disabilities. They are members of a rehabilitation team, which is directed by a physician. Although qualified Physical Therapists may treat many types of patients, some specialize in caring for children or for patients with arthritis, amputations or paralysis. Successful completion of a Bachelor or Master's degree qualifies one to take the State of California examination to practice as a Physical Therapist.
