Allan grew up in New England where he discovered an interest in furniture making while working in the restoration department at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. He went on to earn a degree in history and establish his own furniture restoration business doing work for museums and collectors. He has reproduced many of the iconic pieces of historical American furniture, from the Nicholas Brown Newport secretary to a Reynolds Philadelphia Rococo mirror found at the Metropolitan Museum in New York. He now lectures and performs demos on his craft at schools across the country. He currently teaches classes and takes on commission work out of his studio in Rollinsford, New Hampshire.

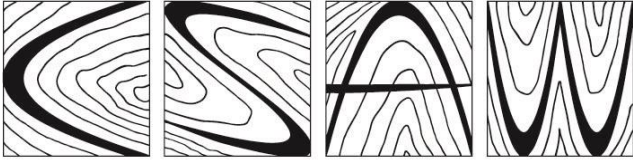
